

Biography



Dr James J. Hughes serves as the Executive Director of the Institute for Ethics and Emerging Technologies (IEET, ieet.org) in Hartford, USA. The IEET comprises several dozen fellows, staff and interns around the world working to promote healthy life extension, catastrophic risk reduction, rights to technological self-determination, and a technoprogressive approach to public policy. Dr. Hughes teaches health policy at Trinity College in Hartford Connecticut, and serves as Trinity College's Associate Director of Institutional Research and Planning.

Dr. Hughes is the author of "Citizen Cyborg: Why Democratic Societies Must Respond to the Redesigned Human of the Future", and is writing a second book tentatively titled "Cyborg Buddha: Using Neurotechnology to Become Better People". Dr. Hughes produces the weekly syndicated public affairs talk show *Changesurfer Radio*, and speaks often on medical ethics, health care policy and future studies worldwide. He is a Fellow of the World Academy of Arts and Sciences, and a member of the Neuroethics Society, the American Society of Bioethics and Humanities and the Working Group on Ethics and Technology at Yale University. Dr. Hughes holds a doctorate in Sociology from the University of Chicago (1994), where he taught medical ethics as Assistant Research Director of the Maclean Center for Clinical Medical Ethics.

Dr. Hughes lives in rural eastern Connecticut with his wife, the artist Monica Bock, and their two children.
